September is National Suicide Awareness Month

The World Health Organization estimates that over 800,000 people die by suicide each year – that's one person every 40 seconds. Up to 25 times as many again make a suicide attempt. The tragic ripple effect means that there are many, many more people who have been bereaved by suicide or have been close to someone who has tried to take his or her own life. And this is happening in spite of the fact that suicide is preventable. **'Connect, communicate, care'** is the theme of the 2016 World Suicide Prevention Day. These three words are at the heart of suicide prevention.

Fostering connections with those who have lost a loved one to suicide or have been suicidal themselves is crucial to furthering suicide prevention efforts. Although every individual suicide is different, there are some common lessons to be learned. Those who have been on the brink of suicide themselves can help us understand the complex interplay of events and circumstances that led them to that point, and what saved them or helped them to choose a more life-affirming course of action. Those who have lost someone to suicide, or supported someone who was suicidal, can provide insights into how they moved forwards on their journey.





Directions:


Butter an 8-inch-square pan and line with parchment paper. Press half of a 16-to-16 ounce package refrigerated sugar cookie dough into the bottom of the pan and bake at 375 degrees for 8 minutes. Toss 1 1/2 cups sliced peaches with 2 tablespoons brown sugar, 1 teaspoon ground ginger and a pinch of salt. Arrange on the crust, increase the oven temperature to 425 and bake until golden (10-12 minutes). Sprinkle with cinnamon sugar.
